#### RIDDELLS CREEK (GISBORNE TOO)

Enjoy gardens and music? Then mark in Saturday October 28 in your diary when they will come together at the home of Janet and D'Arcy Wood, 28 Bluegum Cct, Riddells Creek. Between 1.30 and 4.30 you are invited to stroll around the garden while listening to music provided by the Wrenwood Warblers. Entrance fee is \$10.00 which includes a delicious afternoon tea. Proceeds will go towards the Macedon Ranges project of resettling a refugee family in this beautiful part of the world where gardens and music abound.

The **Refugee Family Support Group Woodend** is a group of locals from the Macedon Ranges united in their endeavour to support the settlement of a refugee family into the Macedon Ranges. Paul and Bev Gilbertson and Robyn Zumstein are a part of this group. The group will sponsor the refugee family using the 'CRISP' (Refugee Integration and Settlement Pilot) model. This settlement pilot is based on a successful Canadian model where local community groups drive the refugee support.

The support includes (but is not limited to):

- Meeting the refugee family upon their arrival into Australia and providing transport to their accommodation
- Provide safe suitable temporary accommodation until the group can secure long term accommodation for the refugee household.
- Provide the refugee household with essential items upon arrival including at least one week's worth of food and groceries, seasonal clothing, and at least one smartphone with SIM card and data.
- Provide the refugee household with weekly income support payments until they begin receiving income support via services Australia.
- Assist with registration for Services Australia and Medicare
- Assist the refugee household to open a bank account
- Assist the refugee household to secure long term housing
- Provide the household with suitable furniture and appliances
- Connect the household with a local GP and any other healthcare needs
- Assist the household to enrol children at school and adults in English classes.
- Provide settlement and integration support on an as-needs basis, to help the household achieve their goals and attain financial and general self-sufficiency for a period of 12 months from the household's arrival in Australia.

To fund the support of the refugee household the group will undertake fundraising activities to engage the local community. The group will be guided by CRSA (Community Refugee Sponsorship Australia) which is an independent Australian Charity appointed by the Australian government to co-design and administer the CRISP model.

The group is grateful to the Gisborne UC congregation for their support already received.

#### COCO REPORT

CoCo met on 2nd September at Gisborne, and most members were present. We discussed the current Worship Plan and also a new plan suggested by Tylden Church council which would mean more time for the Ministry Team to focus on Regeneration Ministry. This plan needs further consideration and discussion before it is approved.

The Ministry Team continue to look for ways to increase community connections. They have been involved in meetings held by the Riddells Creek Neighbourhood House about Disaster Relief and Recovery, and some Ecumenical activities. The Simba Sessions being held at Kyneton Church have proved to be increasingly popular, 40 to 60 people are enjoying these special nights of poetry and song.

We also talked about various roles in the Partnership which could be combined to save duplication of tasks in the congregations, and also the possibility of a single Partnership Church Council and some of the pros and cons if this were in place.



**Act2 -** Change is coming and soon. The aim of regeneration is to enhance community connection; to share the Gospel; to focus on specific generations in order to link in with their values, and to achieve this by active listening, and to evolve flexible forms of worship. The purpose is not to act for survival but in order to flourish.

All congregations voted to remain in the Partnership with most congregations supporting the second option of giving the Ministry Team more time to spend on Regeneration.

Tylden shared with us some of the ideas they have for connecting with community and also about resuming the monthly Dinners around the Partnership. Look for the survey form which should be in your church, to help them in determining how this could work best.

Congregations reported on their particular views re the question that was asked about available property for sale and this was the perfect introduction to Heather Loader who had come from Presbytery to share property sale information and processes with us. She also shared with us information about Insurance requirements and the looming liability for Land Tax for many of our congregations.

This information sharing was a substantial part of our CoCo meeting and we were very appreciative of all the time Heather spent with us and her patience in answering all our many questions. Her breadth of knowledge about anything property related is very impressive.

Chat with your CoCo rep about any property questions you may have, and if they don't know the answer, then Heather is only a phone call away to advise.
