RELATIONSHIPS & DANCING WITH THE DIVINE ON THE LENTEN JOURNEY

If I had to encapsulate one of the most important concepts for all of creation, it would have to be relationships and how we commune with and serve with each other and relate to our environment and the wider world, who we are in our workplaces, in our homes and when we are alone. It can be argued that how we understand our relationship to God and the Divine underpins how we connect in relationships.

I love Fr. Richard Rohr's way of expressing relationship as a dance; a to-ing and fro-ing, a concert of connectedness where there is giving and receiving. In his book "The Divine Dance," he talks about the mystery of the relationship of the Trinity. He suggests that we have oversimplified something that is deeply mystery and in doing so we have flattened the revelation of God to us. Rohr says that it is not that we can never understand mystery, but that it is a continually unfolding revelation to us; like a dance – perfect unity, perfect

community, all and one at the same time.

How does that dance of the Divine play out for us as a community of Christ and as followers of Him? In the introduction in the current edition of, "With Love to the World," Dr Peter Butler writes about Martin Bucer (1491-1551) 'who insisted that the purpose of Christian freedom is to serve others... grace takes place in love." These words again connect us into the depth of what it means to be in relationship. Without service can love truly be expressed? Without an outward expression of our relationships, can that connectedness really be substantial and of any value?

This Lenten period comes to us after a time of unprecedented uncertainty. We have barely met as a gathering of Christ's followers, face to face, in the past 12 months, and the future is still not clear, yet the call is still very clear; "To (continued pg 3)

Lent

A season of preparation and discipline that begins with Ash Wednesday and concludes at sundown on Holy Saturday. During the forty weekdays and six Sundays in Lent, the Church remembers the life and ministry of Jesus and renews its commitment to him in Christian discipleship. The season is the traditional time to prepare for baptisms and confirmations to be celebrated at the Easter Vigil or on Easter Sunday, or during the season of Easter.

Sammy Stamp a summary of the update from February 2021 Network.

Despite moving from the Synod Offices in March 2020 to Trinity UC in Brighton, then having to shut down most of our operations for the rest of 2020 due to the pandemic, the amount of grants given to worthy causes since inception in 1977 passed the million-dollar mark – \$1,012,693

Sales in 2020, up to, and including 16/12/2020 have reached about \$18,975.

Total sales since 1977 stood at about \$1,014,378 at the same date. A special thank you was expressed to Jan Searle who retired during 2020 after 40 years as a volunteer with Sammy Stamp.
