What gap?

Did you pay attention to the election? What about all the machinations since? How do you feel about the result? Happy? Disheartened? Relieved? Depressed? If you are one of the younger generation you probably answered no to the first question and "ho-hum, more of the same" to the rest.

Recent research highlights how disengaged younger people are to the political world. The reasons? "Politicians can't be trusted to do as they say"; "Politicians are two faced"; "Politicians don't get what concerns us – they don't listen, only try to get us on side". It reflects the perception that those in positions of leadership and power are only in it for themselves and their own "tribe". It is reinforced through the media and sales of ideas that appeal to self-interest and the hip pocket nerve.

Other groups and organisations are also having trouble with a credibility gap. The media and of course churches are struggling for credibility. Certainly some ministers and leaders have done nothing to help the perception of a lack of integrity as shown in the recent Royal Commission.

It seems strange that the credibility gaps are well known, including their reasons, yet little seems to be done. We churches are no better.

"What? Of course we are! We are nice people who are loving and welcoming! How dare you suggest otherwise!" And so we are, but...

We also know that if someone from one culture attempts to join a group expressing a different culture, the person can easily feel alienated. Sometimes they don't even know why. The wider community may well be oblivious to the exclusion.

In the church we have in the past encouraged different language groups and cultures to form their own church. We have Chinese, Anglo, Korean, Pacific Islander and other churches. We have perceived this as welcoming and multi-cultural. But it encourages a localised mono-culturalism and a homogeneity.

This approach is now being brought into question as second and third generations seek to find their expression of faith, worship, mission and culture. They mix in different cultures, seek engagement and respect across cultures. Diversity is being valued.

I recently heard of a situation where two people who were part of a church group had a falling out. One was heard to yell and abuse the other in front of a number of people from the group. The abuser was a regular church attender and generally thought to be loving and helpful – "a good Christian". The abused person is refusing to return to the group. The abuser is oblivious to the damage. Maybe there could have been a better way to have dealt with their conflict? I use these examples as illustrations of how there can be a gap between what we say we stand for and how we act and are perceived. Last Sunday we reflected on the command to "love one another as I have loved you". The readings from Acts have been highlighting how the Holy Spirit pushed the church to engage and welcome different cultures and races. Both are invitations and challenges for all of us to go beyond our comfort zones. Both are invitations and challenges to consider how our behaviour, words, language, habits and traditions are perceived by those outside of "our group". Both are invitations and challenges to allow ourselves to be transformed in the engagement with others. They call for honesty, openness and humility.

Yes we face tough times. Yes some people upset and hurt us. Yes we can feel threatened by some plans and actions. Yes we can feel that those in leadership do not listen or have regard for our ideas, ideals, values and wishes. Yet in all of these we are invited, even commanded, to love one another – even as Christ loved us. In all of these we are challenged to listen to where and how the Holy Spirit is leading – even if we are uncomfortable or fearful of the direction. In all of these we are the lived expression of God's life and reign among us. Remember, we will be known by our love.




Kyneton Chat'n'Chew

Report of Coco Meeting held on Saturday 4th May at St Andrew's Uniting Church, Woodend

Meg Evans presented a devotion with a Celtic daily prayer, the gospel reading John: Chapter 21 verses 1-19 and a closing prayer

The minutes of the Coco Meeting held in April were confirmed.

Fiona Bottcher has been approached and will be nominated to Presbytery as the Supply Minister for May – June to replace Wendy Elson.

Bradon French (Inter-generational Youth Ministry Co-Ordinator) will be approached to see if he will present a talk to the Partnership.

Annette Buckley led a presentation on meeting protocols using the handbook: Manual for Meetings. The correct use of the coloured cards was addressed and also how a Point of Order can be raised.

The Partnership arrangements for 2019 were discussed. The topics were: Possible measures of progress made by the Partnership, Sunday worship assistance, New ways of being church and the development of current hubs.

A list of criteria/questions will be put together and presented to the congregations to measure the response to the current worship trial.

It was brought to the attention of the CoCo ex-

ecutive that many congregations feared that the ultimate aim for the Partnership was to close all congregations and worship only at two hubs. This is not true and a statement will be prepared to present to congregations.

Peter Cannon has been adding to the website. The use and accessibility of downloadable services is being researched.

The Riddells Creek site now has wheelchair access and a fully functioning kitchen. The storage shed is also complete.

At Woodend the 'Property for Mission' handbook is to be completed shortly.

The ministry team report was written by Peter Cannon. Peter was absent due to attending the Sacred-Edge Festival .

Annette Buckley has set up Facebook pages for both the Woodend and Kyneton Op Shops.

Treasurer Report – new signataries were nominated for the Woodend Church Bank Accounts.

The congregations all gave a brief account of events since the previous Coco meeting and any upcoming events.

Saint Patrick's Breastplate

June is a busy month in the Christian calendar as we move from the season of Easter through Pentecost and Trinity into the Ordinary Sundays after Pentecost. It is appropriate to look at a wonderful hymn for Trinity Sunday that is included in Together in Song but due to its length and difficulty is rarely sung in our congregations. Together in Song 478, 'I bind unto myself today the strong name of the Trinity'.

Saint Patrick's Breastplate, a Prayer of Protection, also known as The Deer's Cry, The Lorica of Saint Patrick or Saint Patrick's Hymn, is a monastic prayer whose original Old Irish lyrics were traditionally attributed to Saint Patrick during his Irish ministry in the 5th century. In 1889 it was adapted into the hymn 'I bind unto myself today'.

Although Christian in content, it shows pre-Christian influence in that it calls for Christ's protection using a lorica (shield or breastplate). Because of this it is also known as the "Lorica of St. Patrick" or as "St. Patrick's Breastplate". On the other hand, this may be a Scripture reference, specifically Ephesians 6:11–17 ("Put on the whole armour of God") although much more detailed. This prayer outlines Saint Patrick's spirituality and his keen awareness and perception of the battle between good and evil and thus the importance of praying for protection on a daily basis.
