Well in the last few weeks I have had the privilege of visiting our Opportunity Shops in Kyneton and Woodend, including a Tuesday morning sorting day. It was amazing watching the sorting take place. It was incredibly productive, with every person doing their own task with precision and speed! So many clothes, and the hope of a new chance to be loved by someone again. I think there is a deeper message as I reflect on Vintage Clothes. Many of the clothes were something very desirable in their day, perhaps the height of the fashion at the time. For me, as I reflect, it was flared and embroidered pants, paisley loose-fitting shirts and tops, platform shoes and striped coloured socks, with individual toes. (1970's-1980's)

Yet with time these clothes lost their popularity in the fashion world, or just wore out and now they are rare.

A line in Paul McCartney's song goes, "Check the rack, what was out is coming back!" Something to ponder.

When I think about my church experience back at the time of flares and ug-boots I remember the formal services at Buckley Park Uniting Church in Essendon (no longer there) and especially the Sunday evening services where a dozen or so would sit around in a circle and share thoughts, songs, prayers and Holy Communion.
