He suggested that the wonderful work that the Spirit of God has done, and is doing, through their little group of believers is simply this. They are living their faith and their life out in their community and allowing God to use them. They are involved in sharing LIFE itself with their town. In doing this, the Gospel is made known through their love and peace making. So then let us love one another and continue to work together in this struggle for new life. This love is how our community knows who we are. Together we embrace the changes. This sounds like the new and abundant life of Spring to me.

Fourteen members of the Partnership had a delightful day on Sunday 26th July, when we travelled to Wendy Elson's Ordination at Cowes. The small bus load of 11 spent time getting to know each other and chat flowed for the whole trip. Three others went by car. Wendy was beautiful on the day and it was an honour to be present.

The final organisation of Wendy's Induction Service was discussed with the committee deciding we would cater for the event ourselves. Thank you to all those who prepared food it was delicious and to all those ladies from Kyneton who worked in the background to ensure everything ran smoothly. Also thank you to everyone who took part in the service, what a wonderful experience to be in a church overflowing with people.

Manses

The majority of the work has been undertaken at the Woodend/Tylden manse, including new carpet and vinyl, painting throughout, and plumbing works. This is completed to a level where Wendy can live in the manse. There are still a couple of tasks needing to be completed.

Wendy has expressed her thankfulness for the welcome and support she has received since moving into to 'The Ranges'.

Describing her ministry Wendy says her missional focus is to explore the interface between the Uniting Church and the community.

To help the Church realize its connection with the communities in which it has originated. To affirm and strengthen these connections.

Wendy sees her ministry as helping the Church to find its passion for the marginalized within our congregations and beyond; helping the Church to find its identity as inclusive community.

As Deacon, in her pastoral care of us and her sharing in worship, Wendy hopes to help us to see that the Church is not just a worship space but a place where we care for one another and build each other up, resource and encourage one another for our every day lives .

About 160 people gathered at Romsey on the 16th August to celebrate the 150th Anniversary of the opening of the Romsey Uniting Church building. The building was originally opened in 1865 as the Presbyterian church.

The celebratory communion service was led by past ministers, Stan Fishley (1969-72), Adrian Pegler (1984-93), Lorraine Saultry (1998-99 part-time supply), the Moderator Dan Wootton, Wendy Elson (as her first offical event with the Partnership) and congregation members.

As there were more people present than could be seated in the church a video link, installed a few years ago and normally used for funerals, was utilized to the church hall for the overflow. After the final hymn the aprox 30 people from the hall made their way into the church for a group photo. The service closed with the Aaronic blessing. A second photo was taken outside the church.

People then made their way to the Romsey Mechanics Hall for a sitdown spit roast dinner. More people, who had been unable to make the worship service joined us there.

The hall had been decorated by a photo board, church seasonal banners, and the stage with potted plants. The tables had been set with flower centre pieces and alternating red and white table cloths and and looked wonderful.

Member, Trevor Turnaham, ably compered the entertainment including musical items by David and Kendell Allen, speakers Garry Shaw and John Laing, but gave us lots of time for catching up with people not seen for many years.

Riddell Roofing

Riddell is at present going through the restoration of its Welsh Slate Roof. At the time of printing, Glenn, our intrepid roofing contractor has ripped down the old guttering, down pipes and facia boards. Keeping to the heritage feel of the church, he has prepared new, moulded fascias. When ripping down the old, he discovered the original brick layers were not exactly true of eye with the line of the bricks or even keeping the top layers vertical. Made life interesting.

The next step is to remove the original slate being held in place by handmade copper nails, cleaning, refixing and replacing over 200 broken ones with the same size Welsh tiles. The lead flashing will also be replaced and the concrete capping sealed.

Once the church roof has been completed, we can move ahead with our internal painting.


A few helpful tips:

Please leave the stamps attached to paper

(buyers prefer them, less damage due to handling).

- Please trim the stamps cut (not tear) around the stamp leaving a 3mm (1/8 inch) surround.
- Separate the stamps which are 'on' paper from those which are 'off' paper.
- DISCARD stamps which are heavily franked, torn, thinned, biro cancelled or sticky taped.
- Leave PRE-STAMPED envelopes intact as complete envelopes.
