One of my favourite places to be in the whole world is sitting in my rocking chair, in our lounge room, looking out at our backyard and the sky. Life is full of seasons and changes. Celebrating the blossoming of life is something that people are generally good at doing; birthdays, achievements, milestones. However, dry desolate times of life can be extremely challenging and hard to bear at times. It can feel like life will never renew again, but it does and usually in unexpected and different ways.

In my life I have spent a lot of time learning and practicing the art of Spiritual Direction and one of its primary disciplines is around being present; listening, hearing and attending to the Spirit. I love this practice because it moves me and those I sit with, away from the, 'How do I solve this issue?' place to a place of acceptance, honouring and allowing.

Recently I spent some time contemplating where God may be leading me in ministry next and I had a strong sense of God impressing on me, "Be patient". The words spoke to my heart and I knew them to be what I needed to embrace at that point in time. Being intentional about being, listening, attending to my sense of frustration or concern and offering it to God allows space for me to be ministered to and guided for the next step.

"Be patient." Patiently the cherry-plum tree moves through the seasons of being dry and seemingly lifeless, through expressions of hope and flourishing, through periods of budding, blossoming and fruiting then slowly, slowly dropping its fruit and all its leaves to return to a place of rest and replenishment. There is no rushing here. No pushing along the process or demanding growth. Just

In 1942 German U-boats were attacking shipping in the North Atlantic. The British composer Benjamin Britten was on board a ship making its way to England. During the voyage Britten occupied himself by writing the first version of his famous "Ceremony of Carols", set for treble voices and harp. These days this piece is sung in many parts of the world and the Gisborne Singers will perform it twice, first in the Roman Catholic Church in Kyneton on **Sunday 17th November at 3 p.m**. and then in the Church of Christ in New Gisborne on **Sunday 24th November**, also at 3 p.m.

In the 1950s the composer Julius Harrison arranged the piece for soprano, alto, tenor and bass parts. This is the version that the Gisborne Singers will sing, accompanied by harp, and with soloists Rosie Cocklin and Tom Healey.

WHITE GOOSE • WILD GOOSE LOOSE GOOSE

A Goose by any other name belongs to Riddells Creek.

I was surprised to realise the other day that the name **White Goose** for our Drop In Centre and Book Exchange at Riddell was thought to represent only the White (and now Grey) Geese that roam the streets near the Lake at Riddells Creek. There is however a deeper meaning to 'our' White Goose. Some of you will be aware that the Island of Iona off the coast of Scotland informs some of our worship material. Over the years it has, and continues to publish much valuable worship material. Their Publishing house is Wild Goose Publications now often informed by the Wild Goose Resource Group. Traditionally it is believed that the Wild Goose was/is a symbol of the Holy Spirit:

"Legend states that some of the Celtic believers in the British Isles used the **Wild Goose** to symbolise the Holy Spirit instead of the traditional dove. Unlike the dove, which is calm and gentle, a wild goose will attack you and is in essence wild, untamed, and uncontrolled.

In similar fashion, the Holy Spirit is unpredictable – blowing to and fro like the wind (John 3:8) and coming in power (Acts 1:8), disturbing the status quo and setting the people into a new adventure with God."

So it is with this symbol of the Holy Spirit and the Geese of Riddells Creek that the Centre at Riddell came to have the name White Goose. Dare we pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to disturb our status quo and and set us into a new adventure with God? Let's do it!
