Tongan Coronation

About 100,000 people live in Tonga and a larger number of Tongans live in Australia, NZ and the USA. We have many Tongans in the Uniting Church of course, Rev. Jason Kioa having been Moderator of the Synod of Victoria and Tasmania a few years ago. Some Tongan congregations in Australia are still under the jurisdiction of the Free Wesleyan Conference rather than the UCA.

The Methodist heritage is strong in Tonga and I think my Methodist background is one reason I was asked, in 2013, to crown the King and Queen. A second reason, probably, is the “partnership” between the UCA and the Free Wesleyan Church. And a third reason would be my family’s 90-year association with Tonga. My parents, Harold and Olive, served for 13 years as missionaries in Tonga and my eldest sister Janet, wife of Rev. Howard Secomb, served a further 13 years. My late sister Elizabeth was a close friend of the current Queen Nanasipau’u and Elizabeth wrote the standard biography of the most famous of Tongan monarchs, Queen Salote Tupou.

“Daunting” is the word I would use to describe the responsibility of crowning the King and Queen. The Centenary Church was filled with 1200 people and there were media from various countries. I hoped for a rehearsal with the crown and the (queen’s) coronet but that never happened. We did have a “walk-through” with the King and Queen a few days before the ceremony. Leading the service with me were the president and general secretary of the Free Wesleyan Church, Rev. Dr ‘Ahio and Rev. Tevita Havea.



I must mention the music. A choir of 300 made a huge sound with Handel’s “Zadok the Priest” and the Hallelujah Chorus, sung in Tongan and accompanied by brass instruments. The Tongan choirs are extremely good.

The day after the Coronation the president of the UCA, Rev Dr Andrew Dutney, preached to another capacity congregation at a Service of Thanksgiving. The choir that day consisted of Tongans from Auckland - a remarkable group of singers.

For a total of 10 days the Tongans celebrated with feasts, displays, dancing and singing. My greatest satisfaction, on looking back, is that the Tongan people were very happy with the Coronation and its accompanying celebrations.

- Gisborne are undertaking building work to make their church more visible and more inviting. They are feeling an increased co-operation between churches in the town

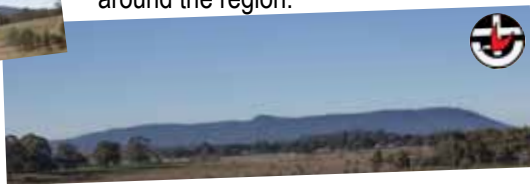

Introducing the Romsey Congregation

The Romsey Congregation are, in August, celebrating 150 years since the church building was opened in July 1865. This seemed an appropriate month to introduce the congregation to you.

The first minister to be appointed to the Presbyterians of the area was in 1861. Prior to that appointment a number of itinerant ministers, both Methodist and Presbyterian visited the area.

On the 9th May 1864 the Romsey Presbyterian Congregation received a land grant near the Five Mile Creek on which to build a church. The foundation stone was laid on the 7th March 1865 and the church opened 4 months later. The blue-stone came from "Eden Park" the property just to the east of the town, owned by the congregation secretary, Peter Mitchell.



In 1873 a belfry was added to accommodate a bell from the ship "Lightning". Later when it became unsafe the bell was removed and eventually ended up on permanent loan to the Maritime Museum in Queenscliff.

A timber church was built in 1886 for the Methodists in Romsey although they had been worshipping in the area since the late 1850's. This building has been a private home since the two congregations became a joint Parish in 1968, nine years before the establishment of the Uniting Church.

Right from the beginning of worship in Romsey both the Presbyterians and the Methodists shared ministers with Lancefield. Early on there

were also Presbyterian congregations in Rochford, Bolinda and Springfield. Additional Methodist congregations were established in Monument Creek, South Rochford, and Newham. These have all since closed.

15 Presbyterian ministers. 20 Methodist ministers and 13 Methodist Home Missionaries served at Romsey/Lancefield up to the formation of the joint Parish. Another 2 ministers served the Joint Parish. Since the formation of the Uniting Church 9 ministers, 3 of them still students at the time, have served the Romsey and Lancefield congregations. We have been without a settled or supply minister for 19 months now and are eagerly awaiting what being part of the Partnership will bring.

It has been difficult maintaining some of our usual programs such as Bible Studies but the Lay Worship Team, that came together nearly 10 years ago, and leads worship at least once a month have grown in confidence. One member has studied, become a Lay Preacher, and is now authorised to celebrate Communion within the Romsey Congregation.

Over here in the east we have a good working relationship with the Catholic, Anglican and Encourage Churches, in Romsey and Lancefield. Each year we join together for the World Day of Prayer, Good Friday Stations of the Cross, a Carol service and a Sunday morning Ecumenical Service. (We are all at the Romsey Anglican church this morning, 26 July 2015). Responsibility for hosting and planning for each of these services alternate towns and rotate between the denominations. The Romsey UC also host a service of Blessing of the Emergency Services in November at which the other churches take part.

Last year a new event, "Follow the Christmas Star" was introduced at which about 120 people

attended over 2 nights. It is sure to become a regular feature of the calendar.

The Romsey Congregation have a small but active UCAF group which meet monthly. Their major activity is the Annual Winter Luncheon which is always a great day and a good feed. This year's lunch was reported on in the last issue.
