I was a stranger and you welcomed me...



It has been very easy for me to reflect on these words as I have arrived in the Partnership and have been meeting new people. Members of the Romsey congregation have been hard at work organising the manse, and when I arrived there were lovely touches like a tray with the necessities for a cuppa, and a couple of little bunches of flowers from the garden. Everyone throughout the Partnership has been very welcoming, and I am beginning to feel very much at home here among the people of the Macedon Ranges. There have been cups of tea, laughter, prayer, conversations, worship, and even a rescue when I locked myself out of the manse in the first week! It was particularly lovely to be greeted by so many of you, and to have my family made very welcome, at the commissioning service on the 14th August and at Mt Macedon for my first service the following week.

It has been so good to experience, because welcome and hospitality are at the heart of our faith. God's love for us is showered on us, even when we have done nothing to deserve it, and we are called to love in the same extravagant way. It's easy to be nice to people who are nice to us, or who look and act a lot like us, but this radical grace calls us to welcome and include everyone, and make a place for them at the table.

So it was encouraging to see that these are things that we take seriously in the Partnership. It's something I hope we will be mindful of as the congregations continue the journey we've started together. Hospitality in a situation like ours requires more than just a one-off welcome at the start, or being friendly when we gather for shared worship or other events (although they're all important!). It seems to me that the hospitality on offer to each other has been based on a genuine spirit of openness and integrity. It shows a desire to really get to know each other and to create a space for relationships to grow and for the Spirit to be active.

This hospitality towards each other can be a wonderful resource as we work together to discern where God is leading us in mission, as separate congregations and as a group. Our hospitality to each other includes an openness to being changed by our encounters with each other. It can provide us with travelling companions, and it can move us out of our comfort zone as we learn from each other and are challenged by each other. It can be a model for how we engage with our communities around us: being open to difference, being prepared to listen with respect to people with whom we might seem to have little in common, and to consider seriously the other's point of view and allow it to shape our own thoughts and ideas. It can lead us to look for new ways of sharing the Good News with people who up until now haven't felt particularly welcomed by the church or the community at large.

So thank you for the warmth of your welcome and your hospitality. It has embraced my husband John, my children, and my extended family. I'm looking forward to seeing where it takes us all as we travel together into the future.

Background

Following the Black Saturday bushfires that ignited or were burning across Victoria on and around Saturday, 7 February 2009, and that were Australia's all-time worst bushfire disaster, the PMPC presented to Presbytery in Council a report from the Victorian Council of Churches Emergency Ministry. This policy was adopted after consideration of that report.

Policy

It is policy that the Presbytery cancel meetings when the proposed meeting date is forecast as a day of fire danger under either of the two most serious classifications, Extreme or Code Red Fire Danger, in the Central Fire Danger Rating District.

"How I became a Refugee" is the title of a video shown at Gisborne church on 19th August. This was an initiative of Rural Australians for Refugees - Woodend Group.

Attendance was small but the audience gained insight into the struggles that threatened families have in finding a country which will accept them and give them safety.

Four members attended a workshop on "What do older people need" organised by the Shire's "Healthy Ageing" group. The budget of \$80,000 won't go far in implementing the many suggestions that emerged, but the exercise was worthwhile, as the number of older people in the Shire is growing quite rapidly.

Both of the above events are examples of the trend for congregations to join with community groups in useful projects. The Partnership we have between our congregations can flow over into partnership with other groups, as Wendy Elson has been reminding us.

On the lighter side, 13 people enjoyed a UCAF visit to the Morris Minor Museum in North Harcourt. We marvelled at the beautiful restoration work that had been done on the cars. For those who owned a Morris Minor decades ago, it was a trip down memory lane.

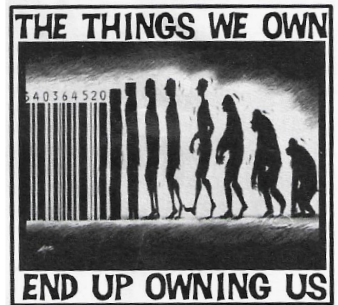

Report on CoCo Meeting held Saturday 13th August 13 2016

Chairperson Colin Chapman welcomed us, especially good to have Annette Buckley with us for her first CoCo Meeting and also John Rigby who has joined us in Supply.

Meg led us in a thought on the lectionary reading – being there for people in today's world . Being willing to do the hard yards.

In line with Uniting Church policy to reach decisions by consensus, we are using coloured cards in our discussions and deliberations –

Yellow: Question to ask or comment to make.

Red/Orange: Supporting an idea or report etc.

Blue: Need for more consideration or discussion. Also negative.

Minutes for the previous meeting were accepted.

We had a letter from the Kyneton Congregation through the CoCo Rep. Some concerns from the Congregation re distribution of ministry resources through the Partnership and the importance of getting this strategy right. Wendy has sent a reply to their concerns. Pip Elston will address this matter at the Kyneton Service on August 14th.

We received a 'Thank You' from Robert Renton for the messages of support and flowers he received from the Partnership during his surgical procedure and recovery.

The Financial Report was accepted after a bit of clarification. Paul Gilbertson thanked Treasurers for being prompt with their payments to CoCo.

Annette Buckley has moved into the Romsey Manse. Big thank you to Noel and his team who organised to have painting, carpets, curtains, hot-plates fixed, cleaning, gardening, new TV antenna and ducted heating all fixed or in the process of being completed. Well done, a huge task.

The lines are in for the telephone to be connected to the CoCo office – just waiting on Telstra for the actual connection.

More training to be made available for the Partnership Website. This will enable individual congregations to make alterations etc. Bronwyn is willing to alter things as required but we need others to be able to do this as well.

Some from Woodend Congregation going to Evensong at Trinity College on Sunday 21st August. Invitation to anyone else interested in attending.

John Rigby is pleased to be part of the Partnership – he is doing some Supply among us.

Meg Evans has enjoyed her 6 weeks doing Pastoral Care Supply and some Preaching. She enjoyed meeting and getting to know more people in the Partnership Churches. Both Wendy and Meg have conducted funerals and had some health crisis situations to help provide support and care.

Meg stressed if help is ever needed to contact the Ministry Team or Church Office.

Wendy has quite a few Weddings, Baptisms etc coming up.

D'arcy's 50 years in the Ministry celebration will be at the Combined Service in Gisborne on October 30th. Arrangements to be sorted with Janet.

Another Macedon Ranges Conversation held. Need identified to train people how to be good listeners etc. Wendy will do this in Services. We need to be able to talk about our faith without jargon.

Another training session will be run re Safe Church. Special emphasis on those co-ordinating the program to attend.

The future direction of the Riddells Creek Congregation was discussed. Maybe to continue as a Faith Community. David Liebich is happy to pursue this. David will report back to CoCo at the September Meeting with a submission as to how this will work out. Presbytery also need to be informed.

Gisborne & Mt.Macedon Churches will both run Advent Studies. Perhaps folk from other Congregations will attend whichever suits them.

After 18 months as a Partnership, we are starting to look at where we are heading – strategies for the future. Rose Broadstock will attend our next CoCo Meeting to lead us in working out the way ahead for the Partnership. We will revisit the Memorandum of Understanding – fine tune this and make it relevant for where we are now.

David Liebich will do the October Partnership In Print as Jay will be away. Thanks David.

Discussion re Ministry plan for September. Ministry team to put this together.

Our next CoCo Meeting will be Robert Renton's last – he is retiring. Robert's input, support, inter-

est and guidance has been invaluable. A Minute of Appreciation to be recorded. Decided to ask Presbytery to provide another Rep. when Robert retires. We feel Presbytery's input is beneficial.

Most reports from the Churches were brief. Good news from Woodend that the Church is again able to be used. This has been a large task to administer. Romsey, of course, busy with Manse renovations. Some others have lower numbers over winter with people going away or suffering colds and flu. Thanks to all who provide meaningful worship each week.

Our September CoCo Meeting is in Woodend with a focus on Strategic Planning.

We also enjoyed a truly lovely Morning Tea – thanks Dot, Marge and helpers.
