

Unity

Around this time of the year the footy gets really interesting. Some of the ministry team prefer yellow and black, some of us prefer white and black and some prefer red and black. Seems we have the black part in common. And mostly we don't let the rest of the colours represented divide us, despite the teasing and banter.

Our lectionary over the last month has held a special theme, particularly through Ephesians, and it is timely for us to read and heed it. It has spoken to us of the nature of Unity. It is a word I struggle with because I believe we are called to it....yet it is so very elusive. Ephesians 2 v 11-22 suggests to me that we construct our own image of who and what is acceptable to God and what unity looks like, and reserve it for people like us. This passage challenges that view and tells us that division is purely a construct and that we need to let go what divides us and make the separate groups into one. It cautions us to remember that ALL are included. Who am I to exclude what God includes?

Then we go on through Ephesians and read the devastating verses about how we are to behave as church. I use the word devastating because every time I read it I recognise how far we are from unity. We are not called on to agree on everything but rather to remember how much we share in common, and to be respectful of the view of others. I have heard it suggested that the biggest 'sin' is the one that tells us that we are somehow separate....from God, from others or from ourselves. Our ministry of reconciliation is about removing these barriers and being reunited in love.

This is radical is it not? Particularly in our current political climate where fear, rather than love, is used to unite us and where we are constantly encouraged to think of 'them' and 'us', with them always being 'other' and viewed with suspicion. The Gospel liberates us from the need to be 'other' and reminds us that Christ dwells within each of us. It encourages us to look deep into the eyes of another (even that is tough to do because it brings us close) and see Christ, to leave our comfort zones and love the stranger and our neighbour and the traveller and the marginalised.

This deep sense of community with all is what encourages us to partner with others, to view Scripture through new and different eyes and to appreciate unity and diversity and every expression of that. The image of the Trinitarian God is a great image of being One, yet representing different expressions of the love of God. We actively seek opportunities then to love the other, to build connections and partnerships which unite us as humans, and particularly as those who love and follow Jesus.

There are always things which differentiate us, some of us support one team and others support a different team....in this sense we can be quite tribal. But these differences are what makes life interesting and cannot be allowed to separate us as such.

I will finish with this lovely call to us to worship in Unity, for the Church is called on to embody Unity and demonstrate God's total love for each and every person (from every race, culture, age and ability). God present in all things.

When politics call us to take sides,

Christ calls us to serve one another.

When issues threaten to divide us,

Christ calls us to love one another.

When injustice and oppression seem to overwhelm us,

Christ takes on our burdens at the cross.

Come, join in worship together,

For we are one faith, one body in Christ, and we need one another. Amen.

Coco Report for Meeting Held on Saturday 4th August 2018

Colin welcomed us to our August Meeting held at Kyneton UC.

Pip opened with a Prayer.

Minutes of the previous Meeting were accepted. Arising from the Minutes it was reported that CoCo will continue to manage Woodend UC. The Op.Shop lease will be extended for a while and the Woodend UC Hall will be used for sorting. Uniting Age Well will use the facility once a month for consultations. Also yoga and singing groups and the Monday Service and lunch continue. Uniting Age Well has a Banner to display when they are at Woodend and one of a similar size will be prepared for each Church.

Wendy prepared the Ministry Team Report for this Meeting and it will be distributed at each Church. The Team thanks Congregations for support over recent months when issues have prevented the whole Team being present. The Report encourages us to look to a sustainable future when funding is not available to support Ministers' in placement. Please read the Report for the details of this.

Following the Report there was a wide-ranging discussion on 'doing Church differently'. The outreach of Op Shops, White Goose, Food Bank, groups using Church properties are all part of worship and service to the Macedon Ranges community. Again, read Wendy's Report for more clarification of ideas discussed.

Church Camp very successful, enjoyed by all who attended either the full Camp or day visitors. A few issues identified, all easily dealt with if there is a Camp next year. Big thank you to both Bronwyn and Peter who both worked so hard to make the Camp such a good event for the Partnership.

On September 1st there will be a CoCo Meeting attended by Rose Broadstock who will report on the Partnership Review. After this Meeting Page 10

options for the Worship Roster for October and onwards will be sorted. The October Roster will be issued slightly later than normal.

The Woodend UC Working Group reported that the cost for works needed on the facility are in the region of \$200,000.00. Drainage issues are the first that need to be addressed. The vision is for an integrated community outreach hub. The Church building to be a multi-functional place for worship in various forms. The Hall to include Op Shop, Food Bank, Café, 'hot desk' office space. Grants for this work are in the pipe-line. Wendy asked for formal approval to sell the pews. Extra help will be needed to staff Op Shop while the existing shop continues and sorting etc takes place in the Hall.

Work at the Riddells Creek property has not commenced. Hopefully soon.

Lyn reported the finances are tracking as per expectations.

Peter reported he is back in the swing of things and up-dating the website etc.

Congregations reported that things are progressing well, many good happenings. Some a bit down numerically due to folk escaping the Macedon Ranges winter.

Annette told us the Department of Justice can connect Churches with people on Community Orders to do some work on Church properties – see Annette re this.

Colin thanked George and Shirley Roberts for the wonderful work they have done over many years at the Woodend Op.Shop. We all wish them well as they have some 'family time'. Their dedication is truly appreciated by all in the Woodend Community and the wider Partnership. George thanked everyone for their good wishes.

We closed with the Benediction at 12.20pm. Thank you to Kyneton for the welcoming meeting space and the lovely Morning Tea.
