

Living in hope

How often have we heard the term, "We live in hope"? And it is true, without hope we are bereft.

Where do you see hope in the world? Daffodils are often a sign of hope. The season of spring often epitomises hope. Many of you will know of my excitement about the recent wedding in our family. Now there is a symbol of hope. The birth of a baby is also a time of hope and expectation. We hold such great hopes for our children don't we?

The Gospel we live by is characterised by hope, we are a people of hope. Our church's rituals, signs and symbols are all about hope. Baptisms, marriages, even funerals and the Eucharist are all important symbols of our hope. Easter and Christmas, the lighting of candles, and prayer itself bring our hope into the foreground. Surely there can be no more profound symbol of hope than the theme of Resurrection which infuses our faith. One of the strongest and perhaps most powerful symbols of hope is the Church itself. Powerful perhaps in its vulnerability, as is the way of the Christian faith. The Church was given the role to hold and embody the hope that is ours in Christ.

So...if we were to do an inventory, how are we going in representing the hope?

How do we offer hope and be a resilient and

eternal sign of hope in this time? There is so much sadness and sorrow and suffering that even we are tempted to despair sometimes. Yet we are called to hope, to be hope and to reflect hope. I believe that it is often in the despair of life that our community turns to the Church, and to its rituals such as meditation, lamentation and vigil. Lamentations 3 v 19-24 demonstrates that even in the lamentation, the pain and despair, we have hope for the "steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end". This is hope worth celebrating indeed.

A number of networking groups in our community are interested in making November 13th "HopeHour" and are asking our churches to celebrate hope in our community with them. Churches throughout our Partnership are being asked to do something on the afternoon of the 13th which demonstrates their hope. We are taking this hope out into the community, perhaps a picnic in the park as some of our folks are doing. This has no real agenda other than to celebrate being together and enjoying our church community, in the midst of our wider community, as a sign and symbol of the hope we hold

It is my own hope that our expressions of hope invigorate our own sense of the hope that we hold and with which embrace our community and our world. That's a lot of hope!



Maligne Lake and Spirit Island




Drumheller's little church - the sign says it can seat 10,000 people - 6 at a time.

saw elks, mountain goats, squirrels, chipmunks, pika, and deer. We soon learnt that a collection of cars pulled up on the side of the road meant something interesting to see. It might be elks rutting, mountain goats at a natural salt lick or even a train.

After we left the Rockies we drove through the 'badlands' and visited the Royal Tyrell Museum at Drumheller which is devoted entirely to dinosaurs, spent a few quiet moments in 'the little

church', were fascinated by the 'hoodoos', and hiked to a dinosaur 'quarry' or dig site at the Dinosaur Provincial Park.



LIVING STONES: OUR CALL FOR JUSTICE FOR THE PALESTINIAN PEOPLE

13 October 2016

The 14th Assembly in Perth last year resolved to establish an awareness-raising campaign on the plight of the Palestinian people.

This decision was a response to official requests from Heads of Churches in Jerusalem and the World Council of Churches. Importantly it was also a response informed by many Uniting Church members who have visited the Holy Land in recent years. Whether participating in ecumenical outreach programs, pilgrimages or their own personal travel, many Uniting Church members have come back to Australia shocked at the inhumane treatment of Palestinians in their homeland.

After his National Ministers' Conference in Jerusalem in 2014, ex-President Rev. Prof. Andrew Dutney shared moving stories of the "Living Stones" - to borrow the phrase from 1 Peter 2:5 - the members of the Palestinian Christian community who endure daily humiliation, intimidation and worse under Israeli military occupation.

As Christians we recall that we are all part of the one body of Christ and 'if one member suffers, we all suffer together with it.' (1 Corinthians 12:26) So in occupied Palestine and wherever else people suffer, we must not forget the oppressed.

This week, in accordance with the 14th Assembly resolution, we launch the Living Stones web page on the Assembly website http://assembly.uca.org.au/palestine. The Living Stones page contains a number of resources to inform and encourage you in your engagement with this important issue.

We commend the page and its resources to you and your Council members, and encourage you to build awareness in your Church and your community about justice for the Palestinian people.

Your prayers, support and solidarity for our Palestinian brothers and sisters in Christ are greatly needed. These prayers together with your continuing prayers for a just peace for Palestine and Israel are highly valued.

The Uniting Church and Palestine

In 2015 our 14th Assembly meeting resolved to establish a campaign to raise awareness throughout the Uniting Church on the plight of Palestinian Christians and the Palestinian people, because:

 Palestinian Christians and the World Council of Churches have asked churches to respond to the suffering of the Palestinian churches and people.

- We are part of the one body of Christ; "if one member suffers, we all suffer together with it" (1 Corinthians 12:26).
- We are disciples of Jesus, whose life and ministry fulfills the prophetic tradition of bringing good news to the poor and seeking freedom for the oppressed (Luke 4:18-21, Isaiah 61:1).

What's happening in Israel and Palestine?

Palestine has been under Israeli military occupation since 1967. The West Bank, East Jerusalem and Gaza are officially controlled by Israel. Israel withdrew from the Gaza Strip in 2005, but over the years illegal Israeli settlements and land confiscations have taken over nearly half of the West Bank.

Palestinians living under occupation endure daily harassments and privations at the hands of Israeli occupiers, which have brought a deep sense of hopelessness and despair to the people of Palestine. Violent conflict in recent years has cost several thousand Palestinian lives and dozens of Israeli lives as well.

The prospects for negotiated peace and the de-

sired "two-state solution" are bleak and Palestinians have little hope for a better future. Palestinian Christians now comprise less than 2% of the population of Palestine.

What are settlements?

Israeli settlements are segregated enclaves built only for Israeli Jews on Palestinian land in the West Bank. Over 500,000 Israeli settlers live in the West Bank and East Jerusalem, alongside 3 million Palestinians.

The United Nations, the United States and many others agree these settlements pose a significant barrier to negotiating peace in the region.

What has the Uniting Church decided? a peacefully negotiated resolu Get Involved

We want to see a peacefully negotiated resolution of the conflict between Israel and Palestine, with the support of the international community. We support a two-state solution. In 2009 we affirmed that both the State of Israel and a Palestinian State each have the right to live side by side in peace and security. We affirmed as well that anti-Semitism in all its expressions is an affront to the gospel of Jesus Christ, and we continue to encourage our members to be vigilant in resisting anti-Semitism and anti-Judaism in church and society.

This awareness-raising campaign established includes the promotion of the boycott of goods from the illegal settlements in the West Bank as part of the campaign. This is a position we share with Israeli peace activists.

By informing ourselves and by committing to support a just peace in Israel-Palestine we honour both our sisters and brothers in Christ and our Christian call to stand with the oppressed. assembly.uca.org.au/palestine

Positive change for the people of Palestine can only happen if there is a groundswell of support. Your congregation might consider: organising prayer vigils; hosting events or forums; writing to your local MP. For more information, please sign up to our newsletter via the website.
