Resurrection

What does the Resurrection mean to you? Easter is clearly centred around this theme and we use many symbols of new life and transformation at this time, bunnies, butterflies, seeds, empty tombs for example. I have just been to the opening of Airport West's new church and the induction of Judy Rigby into ministry there. The line from Revelation 21 v 5 stood out for me...."Behold I am making all things new". Funny how life cycles around....new things commence from old things finishing and being released.

Our Christian calendar would make no sense at all without the theme of Easter, of Resurrection. The event of Jesus breaking in to history revolves around his birth, his life and death, and his Resurrection. Without it our faith simply makes no sense.

That's not to say that we take the story at absolute face value, in fact we need to look deeply into its meaning, but all of us know through our own experience that new life comes through death. This belief, the hope of new life, is intrinsic to our faith and clearly evident in life around us. It calls to us in its linking of courage and vulnerability. The question though, is whether we allow this core belief to fully impact our lives. Sometimes, we find ourselves holding very tightly to life as we know it.... Because letting go asks so much of us. Yet without the letting go, the releasing, the new thing can't fully emerge.

Jesus is alive in and through us. God responds to us at our worst by sending us God's very best. Jesus death was not about punishment but about restoration. God's very heart is revealed to us as we witness Jesus dying for us and then bringing us into a new life of restoration and reconciliation. Jesus reveals for us the nature of God, loving us entirely and calling us to transformation. Why then would we hold tightly to the old, when we can embrace the new?

But....the Resurrection also offers me some other things. First it gives me solidarity in suffering.... and it gives it a point. It also makes it OK to fall and to fail. Life basically has tragedy at its heart. In fact it is often this tragedy, this death, that reveals the joy of life and its meaning. And it is redeemed and made new. The fact that really nothing can be held on to makes life all the more precious and sacred. Discussing this recently, a friend reminded me about how Julian of Norwich describes this. "First there is the fall, then we recover from the fall. Both are the mercy of God". The truth is that often our transformation comes about due to pain and grief and loss. As my friend said, "these are vital to the authentic consciousness of the mercy and grace of God".

So....what do you think Resurrection means to us as a Church? And of what do we let go? Perhaps it asks us to consider how we do our religious institutions. Somewhere along the journey we rejected the concept of a mobile tabernacle and forgot that our ancestor was a wandering Aramean,

that the church is the people....gathered and sent....rather than our meeting house as such. What does Resurrection mean for us as a community, for you as an individual? Perhaps we can re-read Psalm 23 and be assured that no matter how troubled the waters of change around us appear to be, there is a stillness and tranquillity which comes in our relationship with God which allows us to move on without fear. To dwell in the heart of God in the deepest of relationship forever.

Chaplaincy in Schools

The current funding for the National Schools Chaplaincy Program (NSCP) ceases at the end of 2018. Whether it continues or not will be known on May 8th 2018 when the Federal Budget is handed down.

- ACCESS ministries has been advocating for the continuation of the program at a Federal Government level for the last 18 months in conjunction with the National Schools Chaplaincy Association of which we are a key member. This advocacy has culminated with the recent submission of a comprehensive national funding submission.
- The advice we have received from advisors based in Canberra is that now is the most crucial time for the Liberal Party leaders and

Liberal/National backbenchers to hear from the community that the NSCP is a valued program and its continuation is supported.

- In early April 2018, the Coalition government will be meeting to make a final decision on a range of programs including the NSCP. This is therefore the last opportunity we have to send a clear message to the relevant Members that we want it to continue.

There are only a few days left to advocate for the program to continue. We are being asked to write to Liberal Party Leaders and Liberal/National backbenchers.

Uniting AgeWell in the Macedon Ranges

The Macedon Ranges Partnership is planning to work with Uniting AgeWell's Bendigo team to provide guidance and assistance about aged care for those in our congregations, and beyond.

Uniting AgeWell is an organisation of the Uniting Church in Australia with a long history of providing residential and community services

for older people. It currently offers a range of specialised options to support both health and wellbeing, including independent and assisted living, home care, social support, allied-health and therapy programs, respite and carer support, and residential care communities. Uniting AgeWell can also assist people to sign up with the federal government's My aged care.

At a recent meeting with Bendigo's Kerry Egan



and Kaylene deWacht it was decided that the partnership will provide Uniting AgeWell with a Macedon Ranges office for use once or twice a month, or more often if needed. This will provide

a place for direct contact with anyone in the Macedon Ranges interested in following-up what Uniting AgeWell has to offer.

It was also agreed that the partnership will organise information sessions for each of its congregations and for their broader communities. Information about these sessions will be available soon.

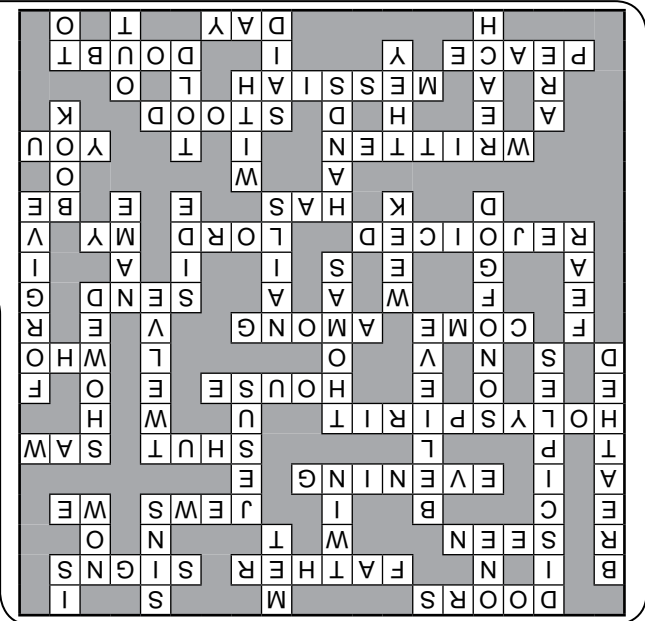

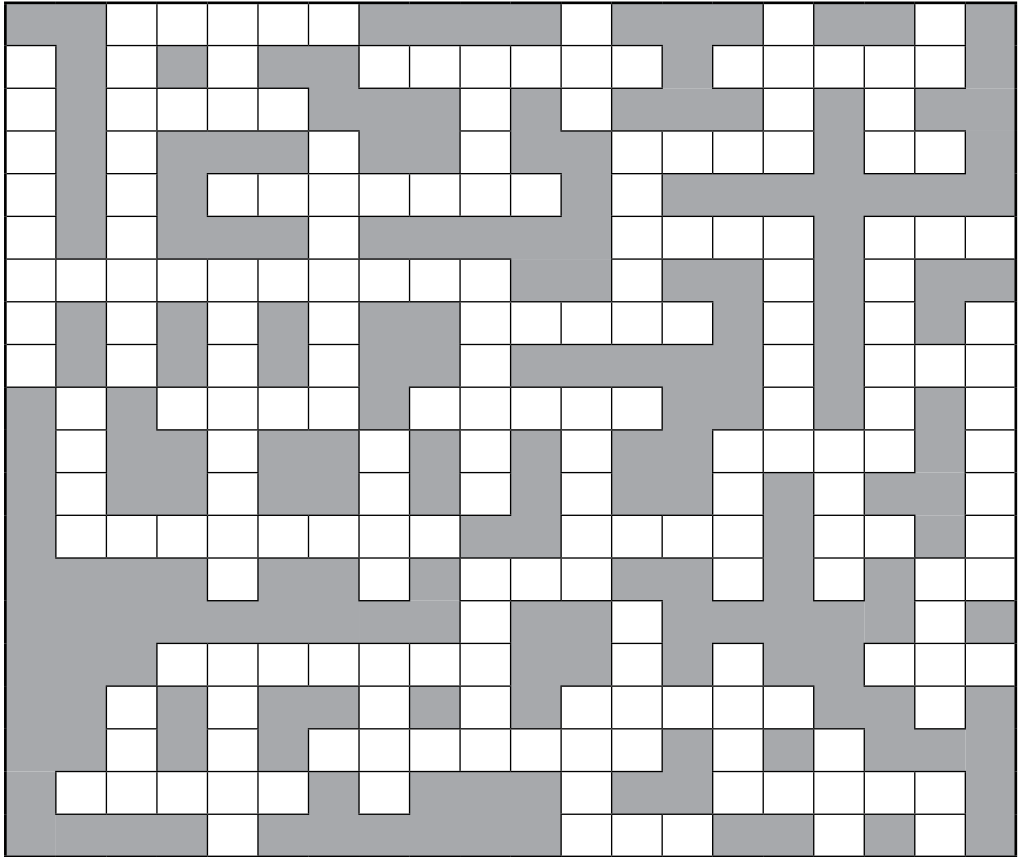
