

The dust that shapes the journey, the cross that guides it, the colour that surrounds it, the light that fades through it, the word that foretells it, the wilderness that invites it.

This is Lent, and into its wilderness God calls us.

Come, brothers and sisters, Christ is heading for Jerusalem.*

With these words, we prepared. We poured sand onto a mat on the floor, placed a holding cross on it, ran a purple cloth river through it, brought a storyteller to it, and placed a small pile of rough stones on it to lay out the background for our story for the first Sunday in Lent. A group of us, from toddlers to wise elders, sat in a circle and experienced the stories of Jesus' baptism, temptation and beginnings of ministry from Mark's gospel. There was water, and silence, and stillness. There were candles next to the stones, later, marking our prayers for those who are in a dark and rocky place, who need God's love and our care. Even later there was bread and juice to share, and words of sacredness and sacrament.

To some, it might not have looked much like worship, what with the toddler who blew endless raspberries at the candles, wanting to blow them out. That's what you do with candles, isn't it, if you're a toddler? Or the children who buried the wooden people in the sand, and placed the holding cross on top of the pile to mark the grave might not have looked like they were learning anything about God. Or the breaking of bread and dunking in the chalice that went on well after the liturgy finished, and the cheeks stuffed full of juice-soaked bread that ensued. There were giggles and mess – surely that's a bit irreverent?

Maybe, but to others, it might have felt like holy ground as we listened and wondered together, young and slightly older, and responded to and with love and grace. It might even have felt like holy ground when we shared the making and eating of pancakes before the 'real' worship started on the mat, a time to work together with hospitality and generosity, and to share the fruits of our work with each other.

The place where all this happened has had its own time of wilderness. There have been rocky

patches and darkness, and perhaps a sense of despair. The wilderness can be challenging and frightening, especially when there's no end in sight. This place, though, is becoming a site of new green shoots of hope. Sunday morning worship no longer happens there every week, but this monthly Sunday afternoon service is providing an opportunity for worship that reaches people differently. Only a few days earlier, an Ash Wednesday service was held. A labyrinth, lovingly created, sits outside. This place is now the site of a welcoming space for people to come each week to share conversation and hospitality. The books so generously donated by people from the community are shared, and some were sold in stall that formed part of the whole town garage sale on the Saturday before the Lenten service. Community groups now use this place for their meetings and activities. There are plans for the future, and much to look forward to.

The story we told with dust, cross, word, fading light and purple cloth was about Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness following his baptism. It changed him and challenged him, so that when he left his feet were set on a new path of proclaiming that the kingdom of God had drawn near. The place where we worshipped has its own story of being changed and challenged to tell about the closeness of the kingdom in a new way. As we journey through Lent, how will we allow ourselves to be changed and challenged? How might we see the nearness of the kingdom and tell its stories in new ways?

Reports

The <u>Ministry Team Report</u> was prepared by Peter Cannon for this meeting.

Peter highlighted some of the issues facing the congregations - please read his report which is available at all the Partnership Churches. He is emphasising the half way mark of the Partnership and preparation for the way ahead when our funding ceases. He also listed the many activities he has been involved in over the past couple of months.

Please also read *Partnership In Print* for the many activities going on throughout the Partnership.

Macedon Ranges Partnership Review Report. - Discussion on what lies ahead when Ministry Team is no longer in placement. Opportunity to develop Woodend and Riddell's Creek in new ways. Ian Kennedy shared different way of conducting Sunday Worship at Lancefield. Belief in the Holy Spirit being at work in the world is essential to our future both as a Partnership and in our individual congregations.

<u>Woodend UC</u> - Much discussion on future plans for the Woodend UC - Many uses in planning phase – Use as an Art Space, negotiations with the Islamic Council. Currently used for Yoga. Notice Board to advertise what is happening. Op Shop storage needs sorting out. Volunteers to move bags sought and agreed to meet on the following Monday to achieve this. Task Force needed to oversee cleaning and leasing etc.

<u>Property</u> - Ian Kennedy reported on maintenance of the Woodend buildings. A Structural Engineer will inspect and report on what is needed in the way for repairs etc. A plumber will be on site soon to address drainage problems. When these reports are available the planning for rectification can proceed. Possibly a group of Woodend people and Coco to move things forward.

The <u>Woodend Opportunity Shop</u> property has been sold – there may or may not be an option to take up another lease. Representatives for Op Shop oversight worked out.

Riddell's Creek UC Report - BOMAR grant Partnership in Print March 2018 for upgrade of toilets, ramp, kitchenette etc to be managed by David Liebich.

<u>White Goose Book Exchange</u> having a positive outcome – local people coming in. The White Goose is participating in an "All of Town Garage Sale".

The <u>Church Camp</u> in July mentioned – publicity to follow very soon.

<u>Financial Report</u> - The Treasurer submitted the financial report – this was accepted.

The Challenge of Secularism for Christianity

Secularism can be defined as:

- the principle of separation of the state from religious institutions, or the view that public education and other matters of civil policy should be conducted without the introduction of a religious element, or
- the belief that religion should not be involved with the ordinary social and political activities of a country, or
- the ideology which either eliminates God altogether or pushes God to the margins.

This year's Peter Barcham lecturer was Barney Zwartz – a Senior Fellow at the Centre for Public Christianity – who addressed the issue of secularism in a lecture delivered on Monday 19th February at the Gisborne Uniting Church.

He firstly discussed the challenges posed to Christianity by the increasingly uneasy mix of politics and religion in Australian society, by the anti-religious agenda evident in the activities of some groups and organisations in Australia, and by the prominence afforded to outspoken secularists. He gave several examples of where and how these challenges have occurred, particularly in recent times. His conclusions were that churches in Australia are in a vulnerable position at the present time, and that there were ways in which something could be done about it. He advocated three responses:

- That faith must not retreat: the church must not give up the "public square"
- That there should be a positive case put forward for religion
- That the church should seek to correct misinformation which is evident in what he called the "history wars".

A number of ways of promoting religion were discussed by Barney Zwartz, with one being the exploration of the concept that Jesus formed a community around him, a community that, at its heart, remembers and rehearses his deeds and words (*Michael F. Bird* (2013) Evangelical Theology: A Biblical and Systematic Introduction).

It was the intention of those who instigated the Peter Barcham Memorial lectures on contemporary Christianity that they probe, stimulate, inform and inspire.

Barney Zwartz certainly achieved these objectives!
