Prayer

As I write this, work is continuing on the Labyrinth at the Riddells Creek church (see the photo on front cover). Preparations are being made for the working bee on Saturday 29th April to complete it. By the time you read this, it is hoped that it will be ready to be walked. You may even have been able to do so as part of our Partnership service on Sunday 30th April.

Labyrinths have been used for thousands of years. Within the Christian tradition they have been an aid to prayer and for those wanting to go on a pilgrimage but were unable to travel. There are several aspects to walking the labyrinth but they are rooted in the desire to seek after and listen to God.

We can see parallels with one of our readings for this coming Sunday. The story of the walk to Emmaus when an unrecognised Jesus meets and shares with grieving disciples, speaks to us of listening for those encounters with God. The disciples speak of how their hearts burned as they heard Jesus speak to them of the scriptures. It was only afterwards, in taking the bread and wine did they understand. The sacrament gave meaning to the journey. The sacrament gave meaning to what they heard.

John, in a recent reading from his Gospel (20:29-31), speaks of the blessing of those who believe even though they have not seen – a belief that is life giving. It is a belief that arises from encountering the risen Jesus, not physically, but in our life journey. It is a belief that is transformative. In encountering the risen Jesus, we cannot remain the same.

Prayer is about communication, even communion with God. While we are familiar with prayers of intercession and petition, we are often less familiar with other forms that focus on listening to God. These include labyrinth walks and contemplative prayer. Sadly we are more familiar with telling God rather than listening. We can miss hearing and recognising the risen Jesus walking with us on our life journey.

In the next month, we will be encouraging the whole of our Partnership to join with congregations around all Australia in participating in 40 days of Prayer. Our leadership of the Uniting Church are inviting Christians from around Australia to participate in this journey as we move towards the celebration of 40 years of the Uniting Church. It is an invitation to share together in listening and growing in faith. It is an invitation for us to allow God to move us as God's people. Further explanation of this is in an article later in this edition of PiP.

We already have many opportunities for you to join in prayer together, to listen for the heart and voice of God. Gisborne has an established prayer group that meets Tuesdays and Fridays each week. In Riddells Creek we have Prayer and Meditation at 9am. In Woodend, we have an ecumenical Meditation group meeting at the Anglican Church and led by Wendy. In Lancefield, the church is open each Wednesday afternoon for quiet prayer and contemplation. In Kyneton, there is a Labyrinth available at the Catholic Church to be walked at your leisure or with others (an ecumeni-

cal walk) on the 3rd Tuesday evening of each month. And now we have our own Labyrinth in Riddell.

If we are to grow as a people of God, then prayer is essential. If we are to move towards fresh expressions of church and allow regeneration to occur, then prayer is at its heart. We need to take time to listen to God as well as each other. We need to depend upon God for life, vitality and discernment

Riddell's Creek - Update

We are going into Partnership with Riddell's Creek Neighbourhood House to use our church building for the community. We are planning some great projects so stay tuned for news.

The Royal Commission and the UCA

The Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse has recently wound up its hearings. Before it did so, the Uniting Church appeared before the Commission to explain what it had done, was now doing and intended to do on the issue. On 10th March 2017 the President of the National Assembly, Mr Stuart McMillan, accompanied by the General Secretary, Ms Colleen Geyer, spoke on behalf of the Church nationally. Toward the conclusion, the President summed up by saying:

On behalf of the Uniting Church in Australia I sincerely apologise to all children in our care who suffered sexual abuse of any kind, in our Church, whether it happened since our union in 1977 or before that in our predecessor Churches. We are, and I am, deeply sorry that we did not protect and care for these children in accordance with our Christian values. I want to acknowledge the impact that abuse has had in the lives of these young people and I am truly sorry.

Our commitment to you is that we will seek to make amends and to ensure that others don't suffer in the way that you have. As church leaders, we pledge that we will continue to understand and to implement the lessons that we've learned through this Royal Commission and will remain open to the insights of survivors and professionals. We pledge to continually seek improvement, to regularly renew our policies and our practices in all parts of our church, and to ensure that they reflect the best quality of care, service and support of children. We pledge to ensure that these priorities are integrated into our organisational culture and practices.

This is our commitment to you.

Cyclone Debbie aftermath

I was called on as a member of the Red Cross Emergency Services to go to Queensland to help out after TC Cyclone Debbie. Originally called to go to Rockhampton I ended up in Mackay doing outreach with Queensland Community Services. At times we had specific addresses of people

who were not able to get to the central Recovery hubs due to ill health. Other times we were operating pop-up hubs for a few hours in isolated communities where they could apply for the hardship grants. My role was to talk with people, to give them an opportunity to unload to someone impartial.

Coco Report

for Meeting held on Saturday 1st April 2017 at Lancefield UC

Chairperson Colin welcomed us and thanked Lancefield for hosting us.

Devotions: Ian Kennedy gave us a thought about Autumn being a reflective time of year, encompassing Easter and Anzac Day. Wendy led us in prayer.

Minutes of the Previous Meeting were accepted.

Ministry Team Report was from Wendy – She discussed the Riddells Creek Church being used in Partnership with the Riddells Creek Neighbourhood House. Property Team will be involved with this, also may need Presbytery oversight. Annette clarified that as the Riddells Creek Congregation has moved elsewhere, the building is a Partnership responsibility. Jeanne Beale will take Wendy's place on Good Friday as she is involved in a family wedding.

Strategic Planning:

- One copy of "Turnaround Church" to be distributed to each Congregation. It is easy reading and contains good thoughts.
- Priorities over next year or so discussed.
- Tylden applying for a Grant from the Simpson Bequest to fund a Camp at Campaspe Downs – involving Partnership Churches.
- Fresh Expressions – discussion on supporting and building on Op Shop communities.
- Kyneton had a Pot Luck Dinner involving Play Group families – good vibes from this.

Safe Church:

Colin introduced Helen Rowe from the Synod Royal Commission Unit re Keeping Children Safe. She explained the Synod Policy is moulded around Government Policy. The information was simplified into 4 points –

1. Have Policy approved by Church Council.
2. All Leaders sign Code of Conduct.

3. Each Church to have a Culture of Safety contact person.
4. Working With Children Certification for all who should have them (Key Leaders etc). People who work directly with Children (in programs etc.) need to be interviewed. Some still seeking clarification on who needs to have Certification. Hopefully another Training Day at some stage – sometimes not effective as too many attend – Synod is under-resourced for these.

Reports:

- **Treasurer** reported everything on track.
- **Property Committee** reported Labyrinth bricks have been purchased – site will be levelled out. Possibly Working Bee on April 29th. Discussion on who does Manse maintenance – don't want to overload Committee Members.
- **Fresh Expressions Team** – Talked about the use of the Riddells Creek facility and expanding on outreach in other areas.
- **Pastoral Care** – See how pastoral care is happening in the different Congregations. Possibly training etc to do it better.
- **Resources** – Website is a work in progress. Team will meet shortly.
- **Congregation Reports** – Many good things happening around the Partnership – Concerts planned, Lenten Studies held, Neighbours Day happenings, Car Boot Sale planned at Gisborne, memorial for Verna Johnson planned at Romsey, Easter Day Community Activity at Tylden, Riddells Creek folk welcomed at Mt.Macedon, Annette conducted her first wedding, Kyneton planning kitchenette for the Church building. Synod are assisting Woodend with legal advice regarding their on-going building repair

problems, when these are resolved we may have a Partnership Working Bee to help get things back on track. Northern Congregations starting time is now 10am. For details of 'What's On' see the early pages of this publication.

- Neighbour Day – various things done throughout the Partnership. Wonderful day at the Asylum Seekers Picnic.

ANZAC Blessing



Twenty one direct descendants and extended family, some from interstate, gathered to remember Private Herbert Golding who with his wife and 2 boys had lived and worked in Lancefield. In February 1915 he enlisted in Lancefield to serve in WW1. Overseas he served at Gallipoli and France where he died on 27th August 1916 during the battle for Mouquet Farm.

For some reason Herbert's name was left off the Cenotaph when it was constructed.

With full support from the Romsey Lancefield RSL, and funding from them, the Macedon Ranges Shire and the family the omission was remedied in time for ANZAC Day.

Immediately after the ANZAC Day service a short service of blessing was held. Rev Peter Cannon blessed Herbert's name and asked the gathered community to commit to 'strive for all that makes peace', 'to heal the wounds of war' and 'work for a just future for all'.
