On the Sunday before I wrote this, we celebrated Pentecost, the moving of the Spirit in a new and powerful way, the beginning of the Church. It's an exciting story, but perhaps a little unnerving as it asks us to contemplate the possibility that at any moment the Spirit might break into our lives in a way we've never seen before, disrupting us and breaking down the barriers

between us and the world beyond.

Of course, the Spirit moves in and through and among us in a variety of ways. In the days around Pentecost, I'd been struck by the variety of ways I'd seen the Spirit moving....

We sat at a table, fully laden with hand made or specially purchased goodies to eat. A visitor from out of town, her local friend, and the friend they'd come to visit who had recently come home from hospital, and me. I had been told the fridge and freezer were bulging with meals dropped in by friends. Cards full of prayers and well-wishes fought for space on the shelves. Through the afternoon other friends dropped by, bearing more food, a warm rug, news from others, and concern that their friend had slipped through the net of those who were meant to care for her. Tea was made, food shared, stories were told. Love and care for each other in the midst of family difficulties flowed. We ended with a hug and a prayer, and the Spirit moved...

We stood in front of the flagpoles in the cold, the Australian flag and the Indigenous flag sagging in the damp and cold. Sausages were sizzling nearby as we mingled, the thirty or so of us, at this inaugural rainbow flag raising for this town. A couple of young people spoke passionately and eloquently about their hope for a community that embraced and included everyone. One man, tears streaming down his face, spoke of his beloved daughter, lost just 9 months ago to depression and suicide, and of the healing power of love and community, and the Spirit moved...

We spoke softly, so as not to wake the lady in the other bed in the room. Hands held, scriptures opened, bread broken, wine shared, The knowledge that this lady prays for me, the ministry team, her friends in her home church and so many others every day. A truly vital ministry where many people would see frailty and loss, but the Spirit is moving...

A preacher speaks at a wedding, and people are astounded that he would dare to speak so freely and passionately (and for so long!) about love. Love! Of all things, in that place, and at that time! Amidst the formality and the stone and the certainty, the story of the power of love to break down barriers and call us into new life is shocking. And it is delivered with joy! There are frowns, and giggles, and mouths agape, and celebration at the audacity and the freshness and the inspiration... and the Spirit moves....

We had met, phoned, emailed and all was in place for the baptism on Pentecost Sunday of the family of four who had reconnected with their faith through the Salvation Army corps in their town where

they live, some distance away from the Macedon Ranges. The website of the corps talks about seeking to provide church for those who don't currently connect with the church, about simply gathering around a meal and opening the bible together and sharing with each other. The family asked for baptism here, because the Salvation Army don't celebrate the sacraments but they had felt strongly called to take this step on their faith journey, and the Macedon Ranges had once been home. When Sunday came, there were the captains of the corps, delightedly supporting their friends, even though this was something outside their faith tradition. Water was poured, bread broken, tears shed, prayers lovingly shared, and the Spirit moved....

This morning as I listened to the radio, people were talking about National Volunteer Week and the variety of ways people volunteer. Cooking meals for those who need them, running footy and netball clubs, helping learner drivers gain experience on the road, Red Cross, parkrun, op shops, Boomerang Bags....too many to mention. People giving (and, some feel, receiving much more than they give), building community, providing for people who aren't enabled to provide well enough for themselves, caring, sharing...and the Spirit moves.

Let's commit to keep looking for where the Spirit is moving, and seeking to discern where we are called to join in. Let's keep praying that we will be open to the breaking in and pouring out of the Spirit in the lives of our congregations, our Partnership, our communities, our world.

At this information session the Uniting AgeWell representative will explain the Australian Government's My Aged Care gateway, advisory and assessment service and the services that Uniting AgeWell can provide.

Although the government has announced an extra 14,000 high care packages it will not be enough so it is best to plan well ahead.



Cycling Week By Week - see opposite 'In God's Hands'

When the World Council of Churches (WCC) was formed in 1948, its members consisted of mainly Western, mainly white and mainly Protestant churches. These days it is quite different: there are dozens of Orthodox churches around the world, plus Evangelical and Pentecostal churches in Asia, Africa and Latin America, totalling well over 300. The absentee, sadly, is the Roman Catholic Church, although that church co-operates in quite a few WCC programmes, such as the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity which concluded at Pentecost (but which is held in January in the Northern Hemisphere). Another wide-ranging effort is the Ecumenical

Prayer Cycle which, week by week, lists countries and churches to pray for. This cycle of prayer is followed in many, many places, including at the twice-weekly prayer meetings at Gisborne church. In a small way this unites us with Christian believers around the world. The Body of Christ is one by its very nature, although, through human error, ignorance and historical crises, we serve Christ under many different names. Praying for our brothers and sisters in Christ, regularly, is one way we can draw closer to each other and serve the world more effectively.
